

What is the Trust?

The Gamekeepers Welfare Trust offers four main areas of help for gamekeepers, stalkers and ghillies and their dependents:

New from GWT: counselling service

Our 2019/20 Raise the Game survey, published June 2020, confirmed the need to provide further services to help alleviate stress and promote mental health well-being.

This has been reinforced by the Scottish Gov't report "Driven grouse moors – socioeconomic and biodiversity impacts," contributed to by members of SGA, BASC Scotland and Scottish Moorland Groups.

From 1 December 2020 we're adding a counselling service to our range of support, which already includes a textline, free helpline, and specially-developed training.

GWT recognise the partners of gamekeepers are often the lynchpin of the family unit and under additional pressure during tough times. HIND is about supporting and encouraging anyone who is, or could be, affected with coping strategies and more.

HIND is free and online with accompanying notes and support throughout. There are 6 delegates on each course, with 7 sessions over 4 weeks, all on a confidential platform.
